- Were there family/friends in Canada? Did a family member precede the rest of the family?
- Who/what was left behind?

- How was a living earned before coming to Red Lake?
- When did you arrive in Red Lake? Which community did you move to?
- What were the reasons for settling in Red Lake?
- Describe the experience of traveling to Red Lake. What mode of transportation was used?
- What was the first impression of Red Lake?
- Were there already family/friends in Red Lake?
- What was your first house in Red Lake like? (size, colour, building materials, drafty or cozy)
- What was the diet like? Describe a typical weekday meal and/or a typical school lunch.
- Where did you work?
- Was any English spoken upon arrival? If not, how were day to day affairs such as banking, shopping, medical services, and school involvement accomplished?
- Was the homeland missed, or was the adaptation to a new life relatively easy?
- What is the most memorable event of the early days in Red Lake?

- Describe the first year in Red Lake.
- What adjustments were made to adapt to life in Red Lake?
- What are the happiest memories of Red Lake?
- When you think about Red Lake, what is the first thing that comes to mind?
- What customs and traditions were carried on?
- What was done for entertainment?
- Did the family belong to a church? If so, which one?
- Were any children born here? Where are they now?
- What would you consider the greatest achievement of life in Red Lake?
- If you no longer live in Red Lake, what was your reason for leaving? Do you come back to visit often?
